LA REGLA

OFF significa que algo se SEPARA o se corta. Take off es quitarse la ropa —se separa del cuerpo— y también despegar —el avión se separa del suelo—. Turn off corta la corriente. Call off cancela: corta el plan.

¡Ojo! — el fallo típico. Decir «turn off it» o «take off it». Con pronombre, la partícula va después: turn it off, take it off.
