LA REGLA

Estos verbos tienen las TRES formas iguales: infinitivo, pasado y participio se escriben igual. No llevan -ed y no cambian nada. Lo único que dice si es presente o pasado es el resto de la frase.

¡Ojo! — el fallo típico. Añadirles -ed igual: «cutted», «putted», «hitted». No existen. Y el contrario: creer que si no cambia es que está en presente.
