LA REGLA

BACK devolve algo ao sítio onde estava: give back, call back, come back, put back. AWAY afasta-o ou fá-lo desaparecer: throw away, give away, run away, put away. São direções contrárias, e por isso put back e put away não são o mesmo.

¡Ojo! — el fallo típico. Confundir give back com give away. Give back é devolver ao dono; give away é dar a quem for, ou revelar um segredo: don't give away the ending.
