LA REGLA

ON tem dois sentidos. Um é de CONTACTO: put on põe-te a roupa em cima, turn on liga a corrente. O outro é de CONTINUAR: go on, carry on e keep on significam continuar. Se algo não se interrompe, leva on.

¡Ojo! — el fallo típico. Usar go on e get on como se fossem iguais. Go on é continuar; get on é subir para um transporte ou dar-se bem com alguém. Não se parecem nada.
