LA REGLA

UP não significa «para cima» aqui: significa que algo se completa ou chega ao seu limite. Eat up é comer TUDO, drink up é acabar a bebida, use up é gastar até não sobrar nada. Se perceberes isto, metade destes verbos deduzem-se sozinhos.

¡Ojo! — el fallo típico. Pôr o pronome depois da partícula: «turn on it», «pick up it». Quando o objeto é um pronome —it, them, me— vai SEMPRE no meio: turn it on, pick it up.
