LA REGLA

Antes de um animal usa-se a, e an só quando a palavra começa por som de vogal: a dog, a cat, mas an elephant, an owl, an ant. No plural quase todos levam -s, mas mouse faz mice, goose faz geese, e sheep, fish e deer ficam iguais: one sheep, ten sheep.

¡Ojo! — el fallo típico. Chamar «rat» ao rato pequeno de casa: em inglês esse é a mouse, e rat é a ratazana, muito maior. E o plural é mice, nunca «mouses».
